Limping in many cases indicates development of osteoartritis.

Every third dog has joint problems and with some large breeds this percentage is even higher – up to 80 %!

In degenerative joint disease such as osteoarthritis, the joint is increasingly getting abrasions and the disease is progressing all the time.

The dog with OA in one joint will often have symptomatic disease in one or more other joints, resulting in variable symptomatic disease burden. Postponing the appropriate treatment often leads to additional joint problems.







1. Initial stage:

Occasionally limping (when jumping in the car or after laying for a long time). The joint is inflamed, but the cartilage is not yet damaged.

Go to the vet as soon as possible!

2. Alarming stage:

Regular limping, that is not improving. The permanent damage to the cartilage is very likely to occur.

The veterinarian examination is urgent!

3. Late stage:

Strongly aggravated mobility. Irreversible joint damage. To relieve pain is the only way of helping the dog.
